From The President:

Hello to all members and friends. The Society has been busy since the last newsletter, including the very successful launch of Grist Mills – The Bishop's Farm. Over 70 people attended the launch with many visitors from distant areas, some of whom told of their memories of growing up either at The Bishop's Farm or other dairy farms.

We also had a successful trip to Appin, visiting St Bede's and St Mark's churches and also properties including Northamptondale and Testons Farm.

The work on the "old" RSL is progressing well and the adjoining wall is certainly looking much better than the blocks and damage we have been seeing for so long. Thankfully damage to the garden from the scaffolding has been minimal and we are assured that is will all be repaired. The builders had to pay a substantial bond to Council, so I am sure it will be restored well. There will be shops at street level and Government Offices upstairs.

At the March and April general meetings we were treated to talks by two knowledgeable guest speakers. Ron Ringer who spoke on the "Snowy Mountains Engineering Scheme", and Gerri Nicholas who has published a book for her grandchildren about her uncle Gordon Scurrah called "One Boy's War." Both of these books are available from our library for any interested members.

The curator of Science, Technology & Industry from the Powerhouse Museum, Margaret Simpson, visited Glenalvon to research and photograph the items in the Alex Goodsell Rural Exhibition Centre. Margaret has sent us a comprehensive report on her research, with photos and she has listed a number of items as "rare." These include Wiard Subsoil Plough, Charles Tripp Plough and Scarifier, Paul No.2 General Purpose Plough made in Parramatta, Miller "Ideal" Incubator, Quirk's "Light of Australia" Safety Air Gas Plant and the A.B. Cohen Maize Sheller. A copy of this report was presented to Alex at the April meeting.

The 2014 Campbelltown City Council Heritage Medallion was presented recently and a number of members attended. The Medallion was awarded to "Uncle" Ivan Wellington for his past and continuing

work in promoting their heritage and assisting indigenous youth.

Members of the Executive met with Council's Cultural Director, to discuss any concerns about Glenalvon building and the garden. A number of safety concerns are going to be addressed by Council. He also arranged for the fig tree which was encroaching on the well and very liable to cause permanent damage, to be removed. Council workmen have also planted dwarf agapanthus around the sculpture of Mrs Macquarie in Mawson Park and located and tidied the site of Paddy Hunt's birdbath and plaque. A number of members had raised concern about the neglect of these important memorials.

Visitor numbers have been good on the March and April Open Days, and we have now purchased two flare banners to advertise the Open Days, and already they have proved to be eye-catching to passersby and encouraged them to visit. I would also encourage all our members who are able to visit Glenalvon – it is something to be proud of for our Society and the district.

We look forward to welcoming 4 tour groups in May, coming from Menai, Blue Mountains, Sutherland and the "Friends of Historic Houses." A very busy month.
