From The President and Curator:

The last few months have been exceedingly busy, and June looks to be the same. Our wonderful volunteers man stalls to raise money, prepare food for Open Days, meetings and inwards tour groups and of course present Glenalvon, its collections and gardens to the best advantage. The roses are just coming into bloom again!

We have had three good stalls this month to raise necessary funds to keep the Museum and the Society going, including leaflet printing and other ongoing costs. So thank you to all who came to help out, - boy, wasn't it cold at 7.30 am at Menangle Steam Fair!!! Lovely weather at Appin though.

At Appin200 there was a great deal of interest in our books, especially those about Appin – about \$160 in book sales at the special “Show prices”. A set even is on its way to Appin in Scotland for their Historical Society, courtesy of Mairi Lester who was an official guest at the celebrations.

Beulah, the Hume property on the Appin Road, has been purchased by the Endangered Houses Fund of the Historical Houses Trust, and tours were run as part of the Appin200 festival. This was very successful for the Appin Historical Society and some of our members joined tours. Pam Bonomini took her camera with her and she is giving us a set of her photos for our collection. John White, the Society photographer photographed the inside of the buildings. Future tours will be available through the Appin H. S. and we will keep you advised of dates etc. It is a long walk over some rough ground so a reasonable level of fitness is required. There are no facilities for parking or comfort.

We have a group from Mt Druitt visiting Glenalvon and Campbelltown for guided tours on Sunday, and another 40 people on a Glenalvon tour the following Sunday. We are keeping out of mischief and raising money at the same time.
